/RAPPORTEUR'S REPORT

RAPPORTEUR'S REPORT (E/2998, E/CN.12/451)

Mr. OLIVEIRA CAMPOS (Brazil), Rapporteur, presented the Annual Report to the Economic and Social Council, covering the period 15 May 1956 to 29 May 1957. ^{1/}

The report, including the Programme of Work and priorities for 1957-58, was adopted unanimously.

PLACE AND DATE OF THE NEXT SESSION

Mr. CLEMENT (Panama), on behalf of his Government, invited ECLA to hold its next session in Panama.

Mr. SANTA CRUZ (Secretary of the Commission) read out a draft resolution in which the Commission accepted the invitation of the Panama Government and decided to hold its eighth session in April 1959 in Panama City.

The draft resolution (resolution 139(VII)) was adopted unanimously.

Mr. CLEMENT (Panama) thanked the members of the Commission for the honour they had paid his country.

DRAFT RESOLUTION FOR TRANSMITTAL TO THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL

The draft resolution for transmittal to the Economic and Social Council was adopted unanimously.

GENERAL STATEMENTS

Mr. ARIOSTO GONZALEZ (Uruguay), speaking on behalf of the visiting delegations, thanked the people and the Government of Bolivia for their hospitality, congratulated the Executive

Secretary and his staff on their fine work, and summed up the progress achieved at ECLA's seventh session. The members of ECLA had met with a sincere desire to discuss their common problems frankly and honestly. They had succeeded in doing so and had made substantial progress toward their common goal, the increased well-being of their peoples and of the peoples of the world. ^{2/}

Mr. PONCE (Ecuador), speaking on behalf of all delegations, thanked the Chairman, the Rapporteur and the Secretariat for the work they had done to make the session a success.

Mr. ZIJDERVELD (Netherlands), speaking on behalf of the delegations of France, the United Kingdom and the United States, as well as his own, thanked the people and the Government of Bolivia for their hospitality, and paid tribute to the work of the Executive Secretary and his staff. He had been impressed by the high level at which the discussions had been conducted throughout the session. In addition to its valuable work in the economic field, ECLA contributed to the harmony and mutual understanding of the peoples of Latin America and thus to the cause of world peace in general.

Mr. PREBISCH (Executive Secretary) said he had been very moved by the kind words that had been addressed to him, but pointed out that the success of ECLA's work had been largely due to the indefatigable efforts of Mr. Swenson, Mr. Urquidi,

Mr. Santa Cruz, Mr. Malinowski, Mr. Hausner and Mr. Giner de los Ríos.

It was a matter for satisfaction that ECLA was now moving from the stage of analytical studies to that of practical action; in that connexion, he thanked the Governments of the countries members of ECLA for the guidance they had offered in the preparation of work programmes. However, ECLA had no intention of encroaching upon the spheres of action of other international organizations, particularly as its own field presented ample opportunities for useful work.

He paid a tribute to the dramatic struggle Bolivia was waging against inflation and the stabilization policy it was applying. He was convinced that the Bolivian Government's efforts would eventually be crowned with success; however, he felt that the task could not be accomplished by the Bolivian people alone. International assistance would be required, to stave off a depression and to absorb surplus manpower. Given such assistance, Bolivia would offer an example of what could be achieved through national effort in conjunction with a sound policy of international co-operation.

The CHAIRMAN said that the Bolivian Government and people had just cause to be satisfied with the work of the seventh session which had further strengthened the solidarity of the Latin American countries in their efforts to attain the goal of economic freedom. He was convinced that ECLA would succeed in laying the material basis on which the spiritual values of the Latin American countries could be fully realized. ^{3/}

The meeting rose at 1.5 p.m.
