The bibliography aims to be a reference guide to help stakeholders and international actors involved in gender issues on the literature available and current research themes from Caribbean and non Caribbean publications.

The selections cited in the bibliography includes recent studies, books, research papers, technical reports and other publications that provide subject information on themes such as: social conditions, social equity, gender relations, women's role, women's status, men's role, men participation, health and social statistics and social indicators.

The bibliography includes brief abstracts of the content of most documents, while the documents published by ECLAC Subregional Headquarters for the Caribbean are available in full text and may be downloaded free of charge.
