1. Adoption of the agenda

The delegations will have before them for consideration and adoption the provisional agenda (LC/L.4256(PLEN.32/1)/Rev.1) prepared by the secretariat, bearing in mind the various mandates of the Commission. Representatives of member States may make such observations or suggest such modifications as they deem appropriate.

2. Economic and social panorama of Latin America and the Caribbean

The Executive Secretary of ECLAC will report to delegations on the economic and social panorama of the region. This will be followed by an opportunity for comments and discussion.

3. Report by the secretariat on the activities of the subsidiary bodies of the Commission since its thirty-sixth session

Under this agenda item, the secretariat will report briefly on the main activities carried out by the subsidiary bodies of ECLAC since its thirty-sixth session, held in Mexico City in May 2016.

4. Report by the Chair on preparations for the first meeting of the Forum of the Countries of Latin America and the Caribbean on Sustainable Development

Under this agenda item, the Chair of the Committee of the Whole will report on resolution 700(XXXVI), adopted by the Commission at its thirty-sixth session, and on preparations for the first meeting of the Forum of the Countries of Latin America and the Caribbean on Sustainable Development, which will be held in Mexico City from 26 to 28 April 2017.

5. Consideration of the request of the Republic of Turkey for admission as a member of ECLAC

Under this agenda item, the secretariat will submit for the consideration of the delegations a note dated 22 January 2016, in which the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Turkey conveyed to the Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean the request of its Government that Turkey be admitted as a member of ECLAC
