


#### INTRODUCTION

This Preliminary Draft Directory as its title indicates is provisional. This work evolved from a former mail survey carried among the English-speaking countries and territories members of CARICOM, which was later extended to the rest of the CDCC countries. As far as coverage is concerned it is incomplete, especially for the non-English speaking countries of the CDCC. However, the Secretariat has viewed the preparation of this Directory as a very first step towards the realization of the mandates for the bringing together of associations of agricultural producers/exporters embodied in the Constituent Declaration and translated into the Work Programme adopted in Havana, Cuba, November 1975.

The progressive integration of the English-speaking countries of the Caribbean, initiated by the Caribbean Free Trade Association (CARIFTA) and intensified by the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) has gathered momentum, and serves as a focus for the widening of the process to embrace other Caribbean countries.

As agriculture is in general the most important economic sector throughout the Caribbean, it is recognized that no serious effort at development is likely to succeed unless due regard is paid to the importance and adequate participation of this sector. The Agricultural Marketing Protocol (AMP) as a special instrument of CARIFTA and CARICOM for generating trade in agricultural produce and for benefiting the Less Developed Countries of the Area (LDC's), the efforts displayed in trying to establish within the CARICOM a general Food Plan for the zone, and within this the creation of a Regional Food Corporation are indicative of this special interest.

The recent creation of the Committee of Development and Co-operation of the Caribbean (CDCC), adds a new dimension to the field of co-operation in the Caribbean that transcends the geographical scope of existing institutions in that area.

One of the limiting factors for the development and stimulation of this desired collaboration is lack of communication at all levels, within which has to be included the inexistence or insufficiency of trade links, and to a lesser extent the language barrier. However, throughout the Caribbean numerous associations of agricultural producers and dealers in agricultural products have been formed and developed without in most cases any virtual link between themselves or without knowledge of the existence of similar organizations in neighbouring countries engaged in the same line of activities.

The Secretariat of the CDCC, with this perspective in mind and aware of the seriousness of this problem has taken the initiative of preparing this inventory of existing and active associations of producers and dealers in agricultural commodities, in compliance with point 6 of the Constituent Declaration  $\frac{1}{2}$  and in accordance with the requisite conditions defined in the last sentence of section B "The Agricultural Sector" of Chapter III of the CDCC Work Programme.  $\frac{2}{2}$ 

This publication consists of two sections: Section A is the listing of producers, dealers and exporters with their addresses, nature of their operations and membership, while Section B outlines their main characteristics such as broad objectives and functions.

<sup>1/ &</sup>quot;Co-operate in the field of agriculture, in order to accelerate the development and use of appropriate and efficient techniques in this sector in the Caribbean countries and formulate joint policies promoting the agricultural complementation of the countries of the sub-region".

<sup>2/ &</sup>quot;Promoting and organizing: (i) the sub-regional production and industrial processing of crops; (ii) associations of producers/exporters for the sharing of experiences and promotion of reciprocal co-operation in the various aspects of the marketing of agricultural products, without discounting the possibility of exporting as a group to third countries".

The Associations listed in this Directory are of different categories. There are associations of producers catering for the local market only, some geared mainly for export market, and some with mixed activities. There are others which specialize mainly in export of traditional export crops. There exist also national groupings of associations of different kinds. In a group by themselves are the Marketing Boards which, besides their buying and selling activities in the local market, serve as state agents for trade, especially intra-Caribbean trade in some commodities. Finally, there are types with important foreign interest and influence.

This publication is distributed to all the associations listed with the objective of stimulating the development of contacts, exchange of information, sharing of experience and finally, within the framework of regional co-operation, develop avenues of joint activities and mutual aid including trade, organization of regional production and industrial processing of crops and identification of new areas of co-operation.

# MAIN CHARACTERISTICS OF THE ASSOCIATIONS AND STATUTORY BOARDS

(ENGLISH-SPEAKING COUNTRIES OF THE CDCC)

#### INTRODUCTION

All private associations and statutory boards dealing in agricultural and livestock products of all members and associated members of the CDCC were requested to submit copies of their statutes with the view of extracting their main characteristics such as objectives and functions. Up to the time of issuing this publication no such information was obtained from the non-English speaking countries; even from a large number of the English-speaking countries the information is still outstanding.

On the basis of the limited information received, the characteristics of private sector associations and statutory boards of the English-speaking CDCC countries are presented below:

#### I - PRIVATE SECTOR ASSOCIATIONS

Under this heading are grouped the following different associations: the Agricultural Societies including those interested in livestock, the Co-operatives including fishing co-operatives and Private Associations of Traditional Crops.

Their divergent nature, characteristics and functions defy the formulation of a common broad objective and basis of comparison. For this reason they will be treated separately.

#### 1 - AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES

This group comprises the national agricultural and livestock societies, and special agricultural associations associated with education and training of young farmers like the 4-H Clubs.

## National Agricultural Societies

Their objectives are of the following two types:

a) "to promote, facilitate and protect the economic production and marketing of agricultural products" of their members as in the case of the St. Lucia Agriculturists' Association Ltd. (created in 1950)

and Jamaica Livestock Association Ltd. (1941);

b) "to disseminate agricultural knowledge, to consider, encourage and advance all the branches of agriculture and all matters and things incidental or appertaining to the society". As in the ordinance of the Agricultural Society of Trinidad and Tobago (1919).

#### 4-H Clubs

The broad objective of the 4-H Clubs is:

To promote the education and training of children and young persons with a view to:

- a) increasing the efficiency in farming and home-making
- b) stimulating interest in rural life.
- 2 AGRICULTURAL CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES

Such societies exist in the Bahamas, Belize, Dominica, St.Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla, St. Lucia and Trinidad and Tobago. The "Model Bye-Laws" of Bahamas and the "Co-operative Societies Acts" of Belize and Trinidad and Tobago were used for the purpose of pointing out the relevant similarities and functions of the co-operative societies.

## Broad Objectives

These societies have been established for the promotion of the economic interest of its members, in accordance with co-operative principles, within the fields of agricultural goods, services and marketing of members' agricultural produce.

#### Functions

The main functions of these societies are:

- (1) the purchasing, processing and holding on commission of agricultural products;
- (2) the buying and processing of agricultural goods for sale to members:
- (3) the assistance in educational programmes;
- (4) the keeping of a 'register of members';
- (5) the provision of financial assistance to members.

#### 3 - PRIVATE SECTOR ASSOCIATIONS OF TRADITIONAL CROPS

The private associations of traditional crops are either of national or regional character. The principal products concerned are sugar, banana, coffee, cocoa and coconut. Their broad and similar objectives are the following:

- To promote, protect the industry and the wellbeing of the growers;
- 2) To carry research and other scientific work on all aspects of the industry;
- 3) To disseminate all necessary information concerning the industry;
- 4) To assist members financially and commercially.

## II - STATUTORY BOARDS

#### 1 - AGRICULTURAL MARKETING BOARDS

#### Broad Objectives

These Statutory Boards have been created by the Governments in general for the purpose of improving the growing and marketing of specified agricultural produce, specifically for securing the most advantageous arrangements for the purchase, handling, processing, transportation, storage and sale of said produce. Almost all the Marketing Boards in the English-speaking countries fall into that category. However, besides the establishment of a marketing fund for those purposes, Montserrat and Belize have established a credit fund for the purpose of providing loans to owners of land, farmers in general and registered societies (co-ops.) and to persons engaged in industrial enterprises.

## Products Handled

They are engaged in the buying and selling of any farm produce or foodstuffs including livestock and livestock products, fish and sometimes forest products. Some articles are, however, included or excluded.

Exclusion

Antigua: Cotton

Guyana: Rice and Sugar St. Vincent: Arrowroot and
