#### ADDRESS BY THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS OF CHILE

The EXECUTIVE SECRETARY opened the meeting and called upon the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Chile, Mr. Roberto Aldunate León to inaugurate the session.

Mr. ALDUNATE, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Chile, welcomed the delegations and emphasized the importance of their task in relation to the coming Meeting of Ministers of Economy or Finance. He outlined the background and purpose of the Rio Conference and stated that the Committee of the Whole was called upon to trace the general directives which would result in the formulation of economic policies for the benefit of all Latin American countries.

#### ELECTION OF OFFICERS

#### Election of Chairman

Mr. DE LA CRUZ GUERRERO (Argentina) nominated Mr. O. Salas (Chile).

Mr. O. SAIAS (Chile) was elected Chairman by acclamation.

Mr. O. SALAS (Chile) took the Chair.

### Election of Vice-Chairman

Mr. DE PENA (Uruguay) nominated Mr. Núñez Domínguez (Mexico) as First Vice-Chairman.

Mr. NUWEZ COMINGUEZ (Mexico) was elected First Vice-Chairman by acclamation.

Mr. YCAZA VASQUEZ (Panama) nominated Mr. de la Cruz Guerrero (Argentina) as Second Vice-Chairman.

Mr. DE LA CRUZ GUERRERO (Argentina) was elected by acclamation

#### Election of Rapporteur

Mr. GOICOECHEA(Costa Rica) nominated Mr. Rodrígues VALLE (Brazil) as Rapporteur.

Mr. RODRIGUES VALLE (Brazil) was elected by acclamation.

#### ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The CHAIRMAN thanked the delegates for electing the representative of the host country to the Chair and proposed that the agenda by adopted.

This proposal was adopted.

/STATEMENT BY

STATEMENT BY THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ON COLLABORATION OF ECLA AT THE MEETING OF MINISTERS OF ECONOMY OR FINANCE TO BE HELD AT RIO DE JANEIRO IN THE LAST QUARTER OF 1954 (E/CN.12/AC.25/3)

The EXECUTIVE SECRETARY explained the importance of ECIA's collaboration at the Meeting of Ministers of Economy or Finance which in his opinion was well timed because there are evident symptoms of a slackening in the rate of development in Latin America without any prospects for future improvement. Furthermore, favourable international factors, which had previously fostered development, had proved to be of a transitory nature and there was a serious need to solve the economic problems which had arisen. This Meeting provided an excellent opportunity to prove that ECLA and the Inter-American Economic and Social Council should and could co-operate to the benefit of the region as a whole.

Mr. Prebisch then went on to report on his discussions and agreement with the Ad Hoc Committee of IA-ECOSOC, which has the responsibility of preparing, with the co-operation of ECLA, the Conference of Ministers. Ample liberty was given to ECLA on the items of the agenda which it should study: the Executive Secretary pointed out that a basic report on the development problems of Latin America was being prepared. Concrete recommendations would be formulated on the basis of this report, as had also been requested, and a small Committee of outstanding Latin Americans had been appointed for this purpose. Mr. Prebisch named the persons who would form this Committee (Dr. Carlos Lleras Restrepo (Colombia), Sr. Eduardo Frei Montalva (Chile), Sr. Evaristo Araiza (Mexico), Fr. Cleanto de Paiva Leite (Brazil), Dr. Rodrigo Facio (Costa Rica ) and Sr. Francisco García Olano (Argentina)). He also thanked the Monetary Fund for having sent a senior Latin American member of its staff to help the ECLA secretariat in this work. As the preparation for this Conference would entail much work outside the regular programme, and since moreover it would be advisable not to have two major economic conferences held too close together, he requested that the Committee of the Whole consider the possibility of postponing the next Session of the Commission, originally to have been held in May 1955 at Bogotá. He requested the support of the Committee for the activities already undertaken in relation to the coming Meeting in Rio de Janeiro and suggested

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that in future Member Governments might accredit permanent delegations to the Committee of the Whole in order to simplify the calling of these meetings and to maintain closer contact with governments.

ADOPTION OF THE DRAFT RESOLUTION OF COLLABORATION OF ECLA IN THE MEETING OF MINISTERS OF ECONOMY OR FINANCE

Mr. MOLINA SILVA (Chile) said that at the Tenth Inter-American Conference in Caracas, the countries of Latin America had become aware of the common problems which affect their economies. These problems might be summarized as follows: 1) Latin America's economy has not attained the proper rate of development; 2) about 90 per cent of all development is financed by domestic resources, and only 5 - 10 per cent by an inflow of foreign capital; 3) the unfavourable fluctuation of export prices considerably reduces the financing capacity for economic development of these countries; 4) private foreign capital does contribute to development, but not in sufficient amounts; 5) public capital should be the main complementary factor, as international finance institutions are not able to assume total responsibility for co-operating in economic development.

As the purpose of the Rio Meeting will be to provide concrete solutions for these problems, and as ECLA could contribute to this task most effectively, the Delegation of Chile proposed a resolution supporting ECLA's collaboration in this meeting and authorizing the Secretariat to postpone other assignments previously commended to it in order to concentrate on this task.

Mr. MARTINEZ (Argentina) expressed the support of his delegation of this resolution. He emphasized the following points: the need of promoting economic development in order to raise the standard of living of the region; resources are limited and when partly used to finance economic development tend to lower the standard of living; markets should be stabilized and restrictions eliminated in order that these countries can place their exports and achieve a relative stability in the terms of trade, and a fair relationship between prices for export goods and capital goods to be imported. He also stressed the importance of technical assistance.

Among the solutions in which his Government is most interested are the integration of economies for a better utilization of resources, an increase in output and productivity; and the problem of disposal of agricultural surpluses. In the name of his Government Mr. MARTINEZ recommended that ECLA's contribution should be limited to such problems as are most urgent

and require immediate solution.

The Draft Resolution was adopted unanimously. (Conference Room Paper N° 1)

DATE OF THE SIXTH SESSION OF THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR LATIN AMERICA

The CHAIRMAN opened the debate on the postponement of the next session of ECLA, stating that the secretariat had proposed August as a tentative date.

Mr. BONITTO (Colombia) regretted that due to former commitments his Government was unable to accept this proposal, but said that his Government would be most gratified at having the Session held in Bogota at any other date, during the second half of 1955.

The CHAIRMAN proposed that the Committee of the Whole authorize the secretariat to make the necessary arrangements for postponing the Session.

It was so decided.

The meeting rose at 11:30 a.m.
