A full stop (.) is used to indicate decimals.

A slash (/) indicates a crop year or fiscal year, e.g., 1969/1979.

Use of a hyphen (-) between years, e.g., 1960-1970, signifies an annual average for the calendar years involved, including the beginning and the end years.

References to "tons" mean metric tons, and to "dollars" United States dollars, unless otherwise stated.

Unless otherwise stated, references to annual growth rates of variation mean cumulative annual rates.

Figures and percentages in tables may not necessarily add up to the corresponding totals, because of rounding.

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FOREWORD

This publication was prepared at the request of Mr. José Augusto Coelho Fernandes, Executive Director of the National Confederation of Industry of Brazil, for distribution to the participants at the third Business Forum of the Americas, which will be held in Belo Horizonte from 13 to 16 May 1997.

Up-to-date indicators on the economic, social and business situation are presented for most of the countries that made a commitment in December 1994 to participate in the establishment of a Free Trade Area of the Americas (FTAA). Due to insufficient information on some countries, notably those of the Caribbean, the publication does not cover all 34 countries that signed the Declaration of Principles and Plan of Action of the Summit of the Americas.

The Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean hopes that the information presented in this brochure will serve as background information for the discussions to be held at the third Business Forum of the Americas and the third Meeting of Ministers Responsible for Trade in the Hemisphere.







Status of non-tariff measures as of mid-1996:

However, Brazil still applies 101 measures, mainly in the form of restrictions on sensitive products, designation of sole importers and requirements for domestic content or purchase. **Colombia:** Nearly all prior-licensing requirements were abolished in late 1990. There are 27 restrictions on sensitive-products and 10 requirements relating to domestic purchase and the production process. **Costa Rica:** The great majority of import restrictions have been eliminated. **Chile:** Applies price brackets to imports of five agricultural products, and a total of 41 restrictions on sensitive products. **Mexico:** Prior licensing has been discontinued and restrictions now apply only to 10 sensitive products. **Peru:** Import restrictions apply to 22 sensitive products. **Venezuela:** Import restrictions apply to 41 sensitive products.


