REPORT OF THE TRADE COMMITTEE (E/CN.12/C.1/15/Rev.1 Conference Room Paper No. 29).

Mr. ICAZA (Ecuador), on bohalf of the Rapporteur, presented the Trade Committee's report (E/CN.12/C.1/15/Rev.1) to the Commission.

<u>Mr. D'ASCOLI</u> (Venezuela) observed that no reference was made in the report to certain important statements made in the Committee by his delegation; he hoped that omission would be rectified.

<u>Mr. SALGADO</u> (Ecuador) assured the Commission that any requests by delegations for inclusions in the report would be taken into account in the preparation of the final text by the ECLA secretariat at Santiago.

The report of the Trade Committee (E/CN.12/C.1/15/Rev.1) was adopted unanimously.

<u>Mr. VALDIVIESO</u> (Chile) said that in connexion with the report of the Trade Committee and the important resolutions it contained his delegation wished to place a draft resolution before the Commission (Conference Room Paper No. 29).

The draft resolution was adopted unanimously.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE I AND DRAFT RESOLUTIONS (E/CN.12/AC./2/12 and Corr. 1; (E/CN.12/AC.42/1 to 11)

Mr. JATAR DCTI (Venezuela), Rapportour, presented to the Commission the report of Committee I (E/CN.12/AC.42/12 and Corr.1).

The report of Committee I was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on co-ordination among programming bodies (E/CN.12/AC./2/1) was adopted unaninously.

The craft resolution on the inprovement of budget procedures (E/CN.12/AC.42/2) was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on stilled labour (E/CH.12/AC.42/3 was adopted, with 3 abstentions (Argontina, United Kirgdom, United States of America).

Druft resolution on UL1200 Seturities relating to primary education in Latin America (E/ON.12/AC.42/4)

Mr. MUSICH (Argentina) recalled that it had been agreed at the Committee's meeting on 21 May to replace the figures preceding "classrooms" and "teachers" in the second proceedular propagable by the words "a substantial number of".

The draft resolution (E/CN.12/AC.42/4), with that correction, was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on co-operation with the secretariat of the Inter-American Economic and Social Council in carrying out economic studies by countries (E/CN.12/AC.42/5) was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on the work of the Central American Economic Co-operation Committe (E/CN.12/AC.42/6) was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on the joint ECLA/TAO economic development training programme (E/CN.12/AC.42/7) was adopted unanimously.

Draft resolution on statistics (E/CN.12/AC.42/3)

<u>Mr. CEREO CEBRIAN</u> (Peru) suggested that it would be preferable to use the term "adequate" rather than "intelligent" decisions in the fourth line of the preambular paragraph.

The Peruvian proposal was adopted.

The draft resolution (E/CN.12/AC.12/8), as amended, was adopted unanimously.

The dreft resolution on economic development advisory groups (E/CN.12/AC.42/9) was adopted, with 2 abstentions (United Kingdom, United States of America)

The draft resolution on the establishment of permanent pavilions and fairs

for exhibiting Latin American products (E/CN.12/AC.42/10) was adopted unanimously.

Draft resolution on teaching the importance of private investment in the ECLA/TAO economic development training programme (E/CN.12/AC.42/11)

<u>Mr. D'ASCOLI</u> (Venezuela) thought the title of the draft resolution not entirely felicitous.

It was decided to entrust to the secretariat the task of redrafting the title of the resolution.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE II AND DRAFT PENOLUTIONS (E/CN.12/AC.43/10; E/CN.12/AC.43/1 to 9

<u>Mr. SIMPSON</u> (United Kingdom), Rapporteur, presented to the Commission the report of Committee II (E/CN.12/AC.43/10, with certain corrections).

The report of Committee II was adopted unanimously.

Mr. Garcia Reynoso (Mexico), First Vice-Chairman, took the Chair,

Draft resolution on We stateward and institutional factors of Agricultural development (E/CN.12/AC.43/1)

<u>Mr. URQUIDI</u> (Mexico) proposed that a reference to the resolution on agrarian reform adopted by the Economic and Social Council at its twenty-seventh session should be added at the end of the first operative paragraph.

It was so decided.

<u>Mr. D'ASCOLI</u> (Venezuela) proposed that the word "areas" in sub-paragraph 3 of the third operative paragraph should be roplaced by the word "regions".

It was so decided.

The draft resolution (E/CN.12/AC.43/1), as amended, was adopted unanimously. The draft resolution on the study of trends and prospects in the production and consumption of timber in Latin America (E/CN.12/AC.43/2) was adopted unanimously.

Eraft resolution on the institutional framework of industrialization (E/CN.12/AC.43/3)

<u>Mr. MUSICH</u> (Argentina), supported by <u>Mr. CERRO CEBRIAN</u> (Peru), proposed that the words "<u>actively and resolutely</u>" in operative paragraph 2 should be deleted.

The Argentine anendment was adopted by 17 votes to 1, with 3 abstentions

The draft resolution (F/CN, 12/AC, 43/3), as amended, was adopted.

<u>Mr. D'ASCOLI</u> (Venezuela) said that he would have voted in favour of the draft resolution in its original form, but had opposed the amended version on the ground that it was weakened by the amendment.

The draft resolution on the study of the metal transforming industries (E/CN.12/AC.43/4) was adopted unanimously.

Draft resolution on panels of potrecharders inch iven and sheel exports (E/CN.12/AC.43/5)

After a brief discussion, in which <u>Mr. D'ASCOLI</u> (Venezuela), <u>Mr. URQUIDI</u> (Mexico), <u>Mr. FON3</u> (Uruguay), <u>Mr. MORALES</u> (El Salvador), and <u>the CHAIFLAN</u> took part, <u>Mr. D'ASCOLI</u> proposed that, in the light of the discussion, the secretariat should be asked to find a more suitable phrase to replace the words "regular programmes" in the second operative paragraph.

It was so decided.

The draft resolution (E/CN.12/AC.43/5) was adopted unanimously, subject to that drafting amendment.

The draft resolution on pulp and paper (E/CN.12/AC.43/6) was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on the planning and utilization of water resources (E/CN.12/AC.43/7), with a minor drafting correction, was adopted.

The draft resolution on the peacoful uses of atomic energy (E/CN.12/AC.43/8) was adopted unanimously.

The draft resolution on water resources (E/CN.12/AC.43/9) was adopted. REPORT OF COMMITTEE III AND DRAFT RESOLUTION (E/CN.12/AC.44/2 and Add.1 and Corr.1; E/CN.12/AC.44/1)

Mr. GEORGES-PICOT

<u>Mr. GECRGEJ-PICCT</u> (France), Rapporteur, presented to the Commission the report of Committee III (E/CN.12/AC.14/2 and Add.1 and Corr.1).

The report of Committee III was adopted unaninously.

The draft resolution on the appraisal of the programme for 1959-64 (E/CN.12/AC.44/1) was adopted unanimously.
