Introduction

This document has been prepared in response to a recommendation from the Caribbean Development and Cooperation Committee (CDCC), that future submissions of the ECLAC/CDCC work programme include information on the resources required for the execution of sub-programme activities, and the projected sources of funding.

In addition to reproducing the draft work programme for the 1994-1995 biennium, it provides a preliminary indication of the quantum and nature of the resources required for carrying out the programmed activities. The preliminary estimates assume zero budgetary growth, and are subject to the final determination of the financial resources available to the secretariat.

It is to be noted that a number of the proposed activities assume the availability of extrabudgetary resources, which the secretariat will continue to make every effort to mobilize.

RESOURCE REQUIREMENTS AND SOURCES OF FUNDING

Presentation

The subregional headquarters for the Caribbean of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean will continue to analyze issues of special relevance to the economic and social development of the countries members of the CDCC with a view to providing technical assistance and advisory services geared to their specific needs. However, to a greater extent than was done under previous work programmes, the work programme for the 1994-1995 biennium seeks to take account explicitly of the needs and priorities of the countries covered as clearly articulated by their representatives at sessions of CDCC and meetings of its Monitoring Committee. The work programme reflects much of the outcome of recent discussions on the role and function of CDCC, and the intention to continue the process of revitalizing it, the beginnings of which process were evident at its thirteenth session.

In keeping with the wishes of the CDCC, the 1994-1995 work programme accords high priority to the promotion of cooperation in functional and sectoral areas both among the member countries of the Caribbean and between them and the countries of Latin America. The Caribbean subregional headquarters will work together with ECLAC, Santiago, and other Caribbean organizations in pursuing cooperation with Latin America within a framework developed during the previous biennium. As part of the policy to promote intra-CDCC cooperation, the high priority accorded by member countries to development of a programme for the removal of language barriers to such cooperation, will be reflected in the work programme. With the same goal in mind, the subregional headquarters will pay attention to the special circumstances and needs of the non-independent Caribbean countries, within the framework of the United Nations system, and will convene a workshop of CDCC focal points with a view to promoting awareness of the functions and aims of CDCC and providing a firmer basis for collaboration with, and among, the member countries.

The issue of island developing countries, has been elevated to the status of a separate subject area in direct response to the repeated requests of the CDCC that this topic be accorded higher priority. Research will be conducted not only on the objective development circumstances of island developing countries but also on their relations with the international community.

In the context of the structural adjustment measures adopted by a number of countries in recent years, social aspects of development will be explored, with consideration given to the role of non-governmental organizations in the development process.

Emphasis will continue to be placed on issues affecting women in Caribbean development and this will include assistance to member countries in preparing for the 1995 World Conference on Women. In relation to the environment, the subregional headquarters will be updating its database on environmental statistics and continuing its examination of environmental implications of development in the Caribbean. Activities relating to science and technology are expected to be assumed by the permanent secretariat of the Caribbean Council for Science and Technology (CCST) which was scheduled to be

established during the 1992-1993 biennium. With regard to population it is not certain whether extrabudgetary funding will be available beyond December 1992 for work in this area, but it is hoped that some means will be found to enable it to continue as an integral component of the work programme.

The subregional headquarters for the Caribbean will continue its annual summaries of the economic performance of the countries of the subregion. It is extremely important to analyze the implications for small Caribbean countries of the far-reaching economic developments which have been taking place internationally. It is proposed to organize and provide substantive servicing for a meeting of economic planners of the subregion to deal with issues of economic and social planning, and with the effects of global and regional economic developments. The implications for member countries of global and regional economic developments will be reviewed and studies will be carried out on economic integration and on the financial aspects of Caribbean development. A newsletter on international economic developments will be produced for the benefit of the smaller countries members of the CDCC in particular. The industrial sectors of Caribbean economies have received rather less attention than other sectors, particularly in terms of linkages with trade policies, and within the context of policies for economic integration in the Caribbean. Study of the industrial sector will continue in 1994-1995, and the mandate to pay attention to the tourism sector will also be respected.

The subregional headquarters for the Caribbean will continue to service the Caribbean Information System, in terms both of its own work programme and of the needs of the member countries. It will also continue to provide statistical support for the delivery of its approved work programme and will provide assistance aimed at the improvement of the national statistical capabilities of the member countries.

With regard to the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS), activities will be undertaken to provide technical support to its secretariat mainly through the services of an adviser.

All the activities planned for the period 1994-1995 will be undertaken in close collaboration with ECLAC headquarters and the relevant United Nations agencies and regional organizations.




