TRAFFIC REGULATION ON THE INTER-AMERICAN HIGHWAY

Draft Resolution approved by the Ad Hoc Committee
on Coordination and General Questions

THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR LATIN AMERICA,

CONSIDERING that a long stretch, representing an important part of the Inter-American Highway, extending from the United States of America to Nicaragua, may be opened to traffic by the end of 1952;

CONSIDERING that the rapid development of a heavy flow of motor vehicles on this highway is to be anticipated over its entire length, thus benefiting the countries which it traverses;

CONSIDERING that the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations, during its eleventh session in July 1950, approved a resolution in which the attention of governments is drawn to the desirability of ratifying the Convention on Road Traffic, concluded at Geneva on 19 September 1949;

CONSIDERING that all the governments concerned should be acquainted with the relevant factors in deciding as to the possibility of concluding an agreement regulating international traffic over this

RESOLVES that the Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Latin America should initiate, as soon as possible, a general study of the international aspects of the problem of automotive transport in Latin America, with special emphasis on those relative to the Inter-American Highway, for submission to the Commission at its next session.
