/DRAFT RESOLUTIONS

DRAFT RESOLUTIONS

The CHAIRMAN announced that the five draft resolutions submitted by different delegations had been reduced to three by the Working Group set up at an earlier meeting. After they had been studied, a further draft resolution on natural resources would be taken up,

- (a) Draft resolution on problems of the textile industry submitted by the delegations of Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Uruguay (Conference room paper No. 24/Rev.1)

Mr. POLLNER (Deputy Secretary of the Committee) read out the complete text of the draft resolution.

1. The draft resolution was approved by 11 votes to none, with one abstention.

Mr. GARCIA INCHAUSTEGUI (Cuba) explained that he had abstained from voting because the organizations to which the invitation was addressed in the draft resolution included the Organization of American States, from which his country had been unjustly excluded.

- (b) Draft resolution on integration industries submitted by the delegations of Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Mexico and Peru (Conference room paper No.34)

Mr. POLLNER (Deputy Secretary of the Committee) read out the ten preambular paragraphs of the draft resolution.

Mr. DELGADO (Mexico) proposed the following amendments: in the second preambular paragraph the term "development strategy" should be replaced by the word "programmes"; in the /fifth paragraph

fifth paragraph the word "defining" should be replaced by the word "analysing"; in the seventh paragraph the word "depends" should be replaced by the expression "is based"; in the eighth paragraph the phrase following the words "Latin American Free-Trade Association (ALALC)" should be deleted; and in the tenth paragraph the words "have placed the Secretariat of the Commission in an exceptionally favourable position as regards the preparation of" should be replaced by the phrase "enable the Secretariat of the Commission to prepare".

The CHAIRMAN suggested that the term "outlook" should be used instead of "strategy" in the second paragraph.

It was so decided.

Mr. BARBOSA (Brazil) was in favour of leaving the fifth paragraph intact because it was more in keeping with the desired objective.

After a short discussion, in which Mr. Delgado (Mexico), Mr. Giorgi (Uruguay), Mr. Villegas (Venezuela) and Mr. Summers (Canada) took part, it was decided to maintain the text as it stood.

Mr. DELGADO (Mexico) withdrew his proposed amendment to the seventh paragraph, since it was connected with the amendment that had been rejected.

Mr. BARBOSA (Brazil) asked that the eighth paragraph should be kept as it was.

Mr. GOMEZ (Colombia) supported the amendment proposed by the representative of Mexico.

The final phrase in the eighth paragraph was deleted by 6 votes to 2.

It was agreed to use the words "enable the Secretariat of the Commission to prepare..." in the tenth paragraph by 5 votes to 4.

Mr. POLLNER (Deputy Secretary of the Committee) read out the operative part of the draft resolution.

The operative part was approved without discussion.

The draft resolution as a whole was likewise approved as amended.

- (c) Draft resolution on forest resources and industries submitted by the delegations of Argentina and Chile (Conference room paper No.35)

Mr. POLLNER (Deputy Secretary of the Committee) read out the draft resolution.

The draft resolution was approved unanimously.

- (d) Draft resolution on natural resources submitted by the delegation of Argentina (Conference room paper No.15)

Mr. DOREMAN (Secretary of the Committee) read out the draft resolution.

Mr. PEÑA (Chile) suggested that the word "agencies" should be inserted after the word "those" in operative paragraph 2 (d).

It was so decided.

Mr. GOMEZ (Colombia) proposed that the words "in order to create economic conditions which will prevent the exodus of experienced technicians" should be deleted from operative paragraph 2 (b).

Mr. PEÑA (Chile) and Mr. BARDOSA (Brazil) supported the suggestion.

It was agreed to delete the final phrase of operative paragraph 2 (b).

Mr. PEÑA (Chile) suggested that the expression "systematic long-term programmes" in operative paragraphs 3 and 4 should be amended to read "systematic long and short-term programmes".

It was so decided.

The draft resolution, as amended, was approved unanimously.

(e) Draft resolution submitted by the delegation of Uruguay

Mr. GIORGI (Uruguay) read out a new draft resolution on the electrification of rural areas and harnessing of international rivers which had not been circulated in accordance with the rules of procedure.

Mr. UGARTECHE (Peru) pointed out that, as the draft resolution dealt with harnessing of international waters, which was in itself a very delicate matter calling for further study, it would not be advisable to consider it for the time being.

Mr. RIOSECO (Chile) said that having received no instructions from its Government, his delegation could not express its views on such a draft. He therefore asked the representative of Uruguay to withdraw his proposal so that it could be taken up at a more timely moment.

Mr. GIORGI (Uruguay) withdrew the draft resolution.

The meeting rose at 5.30 p.m.
