ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The ACTING CHAIRMAN declared open the eighth session of the Economic Commission for Latin America (ECLA) and called for nominations for the office of Chairman.

Mr. MAYOFRE (Venezuela) nominated Mr. ELETA (Panama).

Mr. PONS (Uruguay) and Mr. CHAMORRO (Paraguay) supported that nomination.

Mr. ELETA (Farcma) was elected Chairman by acclamation.

Mr. ELETA (Panama) took the Chair.

<u>The CHAIRMAN</u>, after addressing the Commission, $\underline{\mathbb{P}}$ called for nominations for the office of First Vice-Chairman.

Mr. MUSICH (Argentina) nominated Mr. GARCIA REYNOSO (Mexico).

Mr. CASTILIO (Nicaragua) and Mr. GARRIDO TORRES (Brazil) supported the nomination.

Mr. GARCIA REYNOSO (Mexico) was elected First Vice-Chairman by acclemation,

<u>Mr. URQUIDI</u> (Mexico) thanked members of the Commission for the honour conferred on his country by the election of <u>Mr. CARCIA REYNOSO</u>, who would do everything within his power to ensure the success of the Commission's work.

<u>Mr. GARRIDO TORRES</u> (Brazil) nominated <u>Mr. BOTI</u> (Cuba) as Second /Vice-Chairman

Vice-Chairman.

Mr. PARDO HEEREN (Peru) supported that nomination.

Mr. BOTI (Cuba) was elected Second Vice-Chairman by acclamation.

<u>Mr. BOTI</u> (Cuba) expressed thanks for his election, which was an honour to his country.

Mr. HAUS SOLIS (Bolivia) nominated Mr. MARTY (Chile) as Rapporteur.

Mr. GARRIDO TORRES (Brazil) supported that nomination.

Mr. MARTY (Chile) was elected Rapporteur by acclamation.

Mr. MARTY (Chile) acknowledged with thanks the honour conforred on him by his election as Rapporteur.

ADOPTION OF THE AGEIDA (E/CN.12/516/Rev.1 and Corr.1 and Add.1)

<u>Mr. MAYOBRE</u> (Venezuela) said that his delegation had no objection to the deletion from the provisional agenda for the session (E/CN.12/515/Rev.1 and Add.1) of the sub-item relating to problems of coffee production, since, according to the corrigendum (E/CN.12/516/Corr.1), some Governments had requested that deletion. However, he proposed that the Commission should nevertheless consider one of the background documents which had been listed for study under that sub-item, namely, the <u>Progress report on the ECLA/FAO</u> Coffee Survey (E/CN.12/512).

Mr. BOTI (Cuba) supported that proposal.

The Venezuelan proposal was adopted.

The agenda, as amended, was adopted.

ESTABLISHDENT OF COMMITTEES

<u>Mr. SANTA CRUZ</u> (Secretary of the Commission) read to the Commission the secretariat's suggestion for the establishment of three Committees,

The secretariat suggestion was adopted.

STATEMENT BY THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

Mr. PREBISCH (Executive Secretary, Economic Commission for Latin America) made a statement.

<u>Mr. MUSICH</u> (Argentina) said he wished to speak merely to re-affirm formally that the four countries whose consultants on trade policy had met at Santiago in April and had drafted an agreement on a free-trade zone (E/CN.12/C.1/11/Add.1/Annex III) had in no way intended that such a zone should be confined to the four countries in question. On the contrary, they had intended their effort as a contribution towards the creation of a Latin American common market, and believed that any such agreement should be open to accession by all Latin American countries.

The meeting rose at 12.20 p.m.
