PROVISIONAL ANNOTATED AGENDA

1. <u>Adoption of the agenda</u>

The participating organizations will have before them the provisional agenda (LC/L.1398) for their consideration and subsequent adoption following the incorporation of any modifications they may deem appropriate.

2. <u>Activities relating to women in Latin America and the Caribbean carried out or planned within</u> <u>the framework of the United Nations system since the eighth session of the Regional Conference</u> <u>on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean (Lima, Peru, 8-10 February 2000)</u>

The participating organizations will report on the activities carried out at the regional level since the eighth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean within the framework of the mandates contained in the Regional Programme of Action for the Women of Latin America and the Caribbean, 1995-2001, and the Lima Consensus as adopted by the Regional Conference at its eighth session.
