> DRAFT RESOLUTION APPROVED BY THE WORKING GROUP (Conference Room Paper No. 37)

The CHAIRMAN put to the vote the draft resolution on programming by sectors and areas, and preparation, presentation and evaluation of projects, which had been approved by the Working Group (Conference Room Paper No. 37).

The draft resolution was approved unanimously

COMMISSION'S PROGRAMME OF WORK FOR 1957/58 (Conference Room Papers Nos. 55 and 56)

The CHAIRMAN opened the discussion on the Commission's programme of work for 1957/58 and referred the members of the Committee to the relevant documents before them.

Mr. SANTA CRUZ (Secretary of the Committee), referring to the tentative programme of work and priorities for 1957-1958 (Conference Room Paper No. 55), drew attention to the fact that the secretariat itself had eliminated two projects: project No. 22 (Factors affecting agricultural production), because its objectives were largely covered by projects Nos. 14 to 19, and project No. 32 (Mining), because of the limited resources of the secretariat.

In reply to a question asked by Mr. HALES (Chile), Mr. SANTA CRUZ (Socretary of the Committee) explained that the cost of the study of Latin American timber production and consumption trends and prospects was specifically mentioned in Conference Room Paper Nº 56 because it could not be carried out within the ordinary budget of the Commission and would

entail additional expenditure. Its financial implications would therefore be submitted to the Economic and Social Council, which would then report to the General Assembly. The same considerations applied to the special meeting on Mining Industry which was also mentioned in Conference Room Paper No. 56.

Mr. HALES (Chile), supported by Mr. GISBERT (Bolivia), proposed that a high order of priority should be maintained to the study of Latin American timber production and consumption trends and prospects.

It was so agreed.

Mr. GISBERT (Bolivia), supported by Mr. HALES (Chile), proposed that a high order of priority should be assigned to the special meeting on mining industry.

It was so agreed.

Mr. HALES (Chile), supported by Mr. GISBERT (Bolivia), felt that the Department of Economic and Social Affairs should carry out project No. 12, namely, the study of the influence of taxation on private capital exports, with all possible speed.

Mr. ROYER (General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade)
referred to the secretariat's statement that it could not,
within its existing staff resources, collect and circulate
full information on customs duties and trade treaties of the
individual Latin American countries, as required under Project
No. 41 (Conference Room Paper No. 55, page 19). He pointed

out that the information in question was readily available at GATT Headquarters in Geneva.

Mr. RANDALL (United States of America) said that it was somewhat difficult to discuss a document (Conference Room Paper No. 55) which had been distributed just before the meeting, and which, moreover, referred to resolutions that had as yet to be approved by the Committees concerned. In particular, he wished to have more time to study the criteria adopted by the Working Group for the revision of the Commission's work programme and priorities in compliance with Council resolution 630 A.1 (XXII), as he understood that there might have to be some additions. He therefore proposed that the Committee should adjourn until the following morning, when it would also be able to examine the Rapporteur's report.

It was so agreed.

Mr. RANDALL (United States of America) said that in the Working Group his delegation had voted in favour of the criteria for the revision of the Commission's work programme and prioritie. on the understanding that the explanations given on that occasion by the Executive Secretary would be reproduced together with the criteria themselves. He requested that that should be done.

It was so agreed.

Mr. SANTA CRUZ (Secretary of the Committee) pointed out that it was customary in ECLA to set up a small drafting committee, composed of Spanish, English and French speaking representatives, to review all the resolutions in their final form.

The CHAIRMAN proposed that the drafting committee in question should be composed of the representatives of Belivia, the United States of America and France.

It was so agreed.
