Discussion on the basis of statements by the representatives of the Governments and documents submitted by the secretariat, on the scope and structure of aspects of the population problem in the region and in each of the countries, as well as their links with the socio-economic aspects of development, indicating, as far as possible, those for which urgent action is thought to be required in formulating public policies to be integrated in development strategies.

5. Implications for Latin America of the World Population Plan of Action.

An attempt will be made, with the assistance of the representatives of the Governments, and on the basis of the respective secretariat documents, to analyse the implications of the recommendations of the WPPA, for the Governments of the countries of the region, and the international organizations operating in the region, in terms of the programmes of action, definition of policies, drafting of legal and administrative instruments, research, training and technical assistance.
