A. ATTENDANCE AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK

Place and date of the meeting

1. The Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean held their fifty-ninth meeting in Santiago on 28 January 2020.

Attendance¹

2. The meeting was attended by representatives of the following member countries in their capacity as Presiding Officers: Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Honduras, Jamaica, Mexico, Panama, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname and Uruguay.

3. Also attending were representatives of the following member countries of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC): the Bahamas, the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, Colombia, Grenada, Guatemala, Haiti, Nicaragua, Norway, Paraguay, Peru, the Plurinational State of Bolivia, Trinidad and Tobago, and Turkey.

4. Representatives of the following Member States of the United Nations that are not member States of the Commission attended as observers in a consultative capacity: Denmark, Finland, Ireland, New Zealand, South Africa and Sweden.

5. The meeting was also attended by representatives of the following United Nations agencies, funds, and programmes: Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), International Labour Organization (ILO), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women) and World Bank.

6. Representatives of the following intergovernmental organizations also attended the meeting: Andean Development Corporation (CAF), Association of Caribbean States (ACS) and Organization of American States (OAS).

7. Also present were representatives of non-governmental organizations and other special guests.

C. PROCEEDINGS

10. Mariella Mazzotti, Director of the National Women's Institute (INMUJERES) of Uruguay, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, addressed the opening session, welcoming the participants in the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean and thanking them for the work

carried out during the period in which Uruguay had chaired the meetings of the Presiding Officers, beginning in 2016. She said that the discussions, challenges and proposals that had been shared in the years since the last session of the Regional Conference on Women, held in 2016—including the Montevideo Strategy for Implementation of the Regional Gender Agenda within the Sustainable Development Framework by 2030, which was still being implemented in the countries— had broadened the horizon of women’s equality in the region and the ways in which that horizon could be built around strategies adapted to the reality of each country.

11. She said that, although Latin America and the Caribbean was a diverse region and the rates of development of the different countries remained uneven, especially in terms of achieving equality for women and children, there was still great potential for generating proposals and alternatives, as a result of the commitments made by the institutions responsible for gender mainstreaming and advancing women’s equality at the national and regional levels. Therefore, ongoing dialogue and coordination to advance gender equality must remain at the forefront of decision-making in the region. The fact that the sessions of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean and the meetings of the Presiding Officers were based on the consolidation of mutual trust between individuals and countries was an important value added. The meetings of the Presiding Officers and the sessions of the Conference should continue in that spirit of forging meaningful and trustworthy relationships to improve policymaking in the region.

Adoption of the agenda (agenda item 1)

12. The Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean submitted the provisional agenda for consideration by the Presiding Officers, who adopted it without amendment.

Report of the Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean (agenda item 2)

13. The Chair of the Presiding Officers reported on the activities carried out from 2016 to the beginning of 2020, a period during which much of the work carried out at the meetings of the Presiding Officers had focused on organizing the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference around the theme of women’s autonomy in changing economic scenarios. She said that over those three years, through their meetings, the Presiding Officers had also made progress towards establishing the Regional Fund in support of Women’s and Feminist Organizations and Movements. The creation of the fund had been formally approved in 2016, at the thirteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, and the fund’s structure and rules of procedure had been unanimously adopted at the fifty-seventh meeting of the Presiding Officers in July 2018. On 22 August 2019, at a special virtual meeting of the Presiding Officers, supported by the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC, which had enjoyed a high level of participation by member States, the terms of the Fund’s first call for project proposals had been preliminarily approved.

14. She remarked that the establishment of the Regional Fund was an extremely important achievement. She said that it was an invaluable tool for involving civil society and women’s and feminist organizations and movements, as well as governments, in the process of advancing women’s rights in the region. While approval of the successive phases of the Fund had been possible thanks to the participation of many countries, the contribution of the National Women’s Institute of Mexico had been noteworthy. In light of the meetings and efforts made to move forward with development of the Regional Fund, she proposed that its terms be adopted, which had been drawn up on the basis of documents already adopted by

the Presiding Officers, based on the Montevideo Strategy, and were in keeping with the key areas to be addressed at the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, the thematic focus of which was women's autonomy in changing economic scenarios.

15. She said that, in the near future, the work of the Board of Directors of the Fund would include updating the workplan for mobilizing financial resources. Uruguay would be responsible for carrying out that task, while Chile had expressed interest in overseeing aspects of the Fund's administration agreement. While all the participating governments had shown great commitment to taking that initiative forward, some had taken the additional step of pledging to become donors to the Fund. The Commission, through its Division for Gender Affairs, would continue to play an advisory role regarding the functioning of the Fund. Recalling that the Fund had been created on a voluntary basis in accordance with the capacities of each of the countries of the region, she stressed the importance of the workplan to mobilize resources to support the Fund. Lastly, she expressed the hope that the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, as well as future meetings of the Presiding Officers, would continue to promote that critical work.

16. The representative of the secretariat welcomed Isabel Plá, Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, representative of the host country and incoming Chair of the Conference, and invited her to take the floor.

17. After thanking the Director of the National Women's Institute (INMUJERES) of Uruguay for her work as Chair of the Presiding Officers and in her professional capacity, and recognizing that work as part of the legacy of the Conference, the Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile said that the Government of Chile assumed the responsibility of Chair with humility, mindful of the platform's important work over the past 40 years, and that it hoped to receive the opportune advice of the Presiding Officers. She expressed the hope that the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference would conclude with a series of commitments and a road map that would be challenging for the countries and, at the same time, representative not only of the visions of governments but of all women in the region, who hoped that a political agreement could be reached to develop a regional framework to promote gender equality in the region in the years to come.

18. Lastly, the representative of the secretariat asked the country representatives to indicate whether they were interested in serving among the Presiding Officers of the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Report by the secretariat on the organization of work for the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean (Santiago, 27–31 January 2020) (agenda item 3)

19. The representative of the secretariat thanked attendees for their valuable participation and provided logistical information on the necessary formalities for the work to be carried out during the fourteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean. He added that the topics covered in the position paper would form the basis of the discussions to be held over the course of the week, with a view to adopting the Santiago Commitment at the end of the session.

Closing session

20. The Director of the National Women's Institute (INMUJERES) of Uruguay, in her capacity as outgoing Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and

the Caribbean, said that representatives of national machineries for the advancement of women would hold numerous side events during the fourteenth session of the Conference, at which very important issues would be addressed, that she hoped could be analysed in a joined up manner, in order to help to improve the situation of women and girls in the countries of the region. In particular, it was important to share the progress made in implementing the Montevideo Strategy and the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, in the context of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women, reflecting on what had been achieved in recent years, the obstacles that women and girls had faced and the main unresolved challenges to achieving substantive equality.
