## A. ATTENDANCE AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK

### Place and date of the meeting

1. The Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean held a special meeting in a hybrid format in Santiago from 22–23 June 2022.

### Attendance<sup>1</sup>

2. The meeting was attended by representatives of the following member countries in their capacity as Presiding Officers: Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Jamaica, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Plurinational State of Bolivia, Suriname and Uruguay.

3. Also attending were representatives of the following member countries of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC): Belize, Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, Colombia, Dominica, Guatemala, Guyana, Honduras, Netherlands, Norway, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Spain and Trinidad and Tobago.

4. The following associate members of the Commission were also represented: Anguilla, British Virgin Islands, Montserrat and Puerto Rico.

5. From the United Nations Secretariat, the Development Coordination Office (DCO) and resident coordinators participated.

### C. SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS

11. At the opening session, statements were made by Raul García-Buchaca, Deputy Executive Secretary for Management and Programme Analysis of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC); María-Noel Vaeza, Regional Director for the Americas and the Caribbean of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women); and Antonia Orellana, Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean.

12. The Deputy Executive Secretary for Management and Programme Analysis of ECLAC said that he was pleased to be able to hold a face-to-face meeting following the two years of distancing that the pandemic had required. Chile, the host country of the meeting, would bring a feminist and state-of-the-art approach to the discussions. Deliberations would focus, firstly, on preparations for the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, to be held in November in Argentina. The pandemic had affected women's economic, physical and decision-making autonomy, their labour force participation and their excessive burden of care work in several ways. That had been compounded by the repercussions of the war in Ukraine, which would drive inflation and affect the recovery in employment, especially for women in the region. A new pattern of development urgently needed to be adopted, achieving a sustainable recovery with gender equality and moving towards a care society in which time, work, resources and power were better redistributed. The second main theme of the meeting would be commemoration of the forty-fifth anniversary of the Regional Gender Agenda, an instrument that guided gender equality policies in the countries of the region. Latin America and the Caribbean was the only region of the world that had been promoting such an agenda for 45 years, but coordination among the various stakeholders needed to be strengthened, to continue to expand the Agenda and ensure its implementation. He concluded by expressing his certainty that the meeting would contribute to continued work to fulfil the desire to build a future of sustainable development, with equality and sustainability of life as key principles, in order to achieve the change of era the region sought.

13. The Regional Director for the Americas and the Caribbean of UN-Women said that Latin America and the Caribbean was the only region with a regional conference on women and that, at such a time of uncertainty—with a war in Europe, inflation, a pandemic that had not yet ended and a shadow pandemic of violence against women—achievements such as the 45 years of the Regional Gender Agenda should be applauded. The former Executive Secretary of ECLAC, Enrique Iglesias, had championed the first Regional Conference on the Integration of Women in the Economic and Social Development of Latin America, at a time when women were not taken into account. It should be celebrated that women had the opportunity to discuss public policies and progress relating to life and protection of the region. The theme of the next session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean would therefore be the care society, and it was vital that that issue be put at the heart of all stakeholders' discussions and efforts, because without care systems women would not have the time to participate in political life. It was her conviction that progress needed to be made toward public, private and community-based care systems, with the budgets and infrastructure required to enable women to undertake paid work. She welcomed the strategic partnership with ECLAC and stressed the importance of participation by the region's social movements and the need for governments, civil society, academia, the private sector and international organizations to join forces to make progress towards equality. Over the preceding 45 years, many steps forward had been made, but there were also threats, and the rights that had been won should be defended steadfastly, allowing no setbacks. Political will to put women at the centre of the region was essential.

14. The Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, thanked the teams of ECLAC, UN-Women and all the countries for their work, and highlighted the efforts made over the prior 45 years to make the Regional Gender Agenda a reality that transformed the lives of women and girls every day. She said that the global context that had increased the difficulties women and girls faced and their situation had changed and new paths and possibilities had opened up, but political and financial will was also needed to protect those achievements and prevent setbacks. The equality women longed for and the promised tangible improvements in their lives needed to be made a reality, in order to legitimize democracy. The pandemic had exacerbated the unfair distribution of care work, driven many women out of the labour force, and intensified domestic violence and violence against girls. Hate speech against women and persons with diverse sexual identities had also worsened, as had various forms of disparagement of equality, although the impact of such speech was less pronounced in countries with stronger democratic institutions. It was crucial for there to be a paradigm shift to societies that cared for life. In closing, the Minister said that the first call for applications to the Regional Fund in Support of Women's and Feminist Organizations and Movements had resulted in more than 200 proposals being received. The evaluation committee had carefully analysed the proposals and selected 18 civil society organizations engaged in activities relating to the goals and commitments of the Regional Gender Agenda.

Adoption of the agenda (agenda item 1)

15. The Chair of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean submitted the provisional agenda for consideration by the Presiding Officers, who adopted it without amendment.

Presentation of progress in the preparation of the position document for the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean (agenda item 2)

16. The document was presented by Ana Gúezmes García, Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC, who reflected on the impact of the prevailing circumstances on gender equality in the region. She presented the structure of the position document for the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, which addressed issues such as gender equality and the care society, the inescapable link between the sexual division of labour and gender inequality, the present and future organization of care, macroeconomic and global challenges for the care society and the role of the State in the care society. She said that the document would propose the care society as a response to the crisis, which entailed moving towards a new pattern of development with care and sustainability of life at its centre. The document would also contain proposed measures to move towards economic, environmental and gender justice.

17. In the ensuing discussion, the representative of Argentina said that the document identified gender inequalities as a factor that was inextricable from development and stressed the need to make progress on international care standards. She suggested the document strengthen the intersectional perspective and the link between gender-based violence and the unfair social organization of care and examine the processes through which public debt was accumulated from a feminist perspective.

18. The representative of the Dominican Republic said her country had made efforts to constitute an Intersectoral Care Committee with the aim of implementing a national care system in the country and suggested attaching greater importance to digitalization in the area of care. Social and economic value could be added to care through public-private partnerships and strategies for care services, institutional and legal frameworks to guarantee the rights to give and receive care, and training and professionalization.

19. The representative of Ecuador said that public policies urgently needed to be formulated that took into account women and their diversity and guaranteed women's participation in the economic, cultural, political and social spheres. Ecuador had made a number of efforts in that respect.
20. The representative of Costa Rica said there was a pressing need for truly shared responsibility for care in society. Care was a right and a public good and it was important to include it in national agendas for economic recovery and in debates on government budgets. It was also imperative to acknowledge and draw on women's role as managers of care for nature and biodiversity.
21. The representative of Cuba acknowledged the special challenge that Cuba would face with respect to care, owing to population ageing, an issue that was addressed in its draft Family Code.
22. The representative of Nicaragua suggested including an analysis of the impact of unilateral coercive measures that had affected the lives of women and girls, which had been rejected in agreement 4 of the sixty-first meeting of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean.<sup>2</sup>
23. The representative of El Salvador stressed the importance of coordination among different institutions and highlighted the work of her country's government in that regard. She also requested technical support and cooperation to share experiences in the region.
24. The representative of Antigua and Barbuda stressed the need to redistribute care work and expressed his country's desire to act at the next Regional Conference as a first mover in energizing regional efforts to move towards a more inclusive recovery.
25. The representative of Montserrat requested that the intergenerational approach be strengthened to address the situation of older women and the discrimination they suffered.
26. The representative of Chile underscored the importance of the fiscal covenant, given the limitations faced by countries in financing care systems in the long term. She said that a progressive increase in public care infrastructure would be required and the Government of Chile had made efforts move towards a national care system.
27. The representative of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) reaffirmed the Fund's support for the subsidiary bodies of ECLAC and especially the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean. She then highlighted the synergies between the Montevideo Strategy for Implementation of the Regional Gender Agenda within the Sustainable Development Framework by 2030 and the Montevideo Consensus on Population and Development. She also expressed her agreement on the importance of the intersectional approach when analysing care issues.
28. The representative of the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) welcomed the document's intergenerational approach and called for continued progress in that regard. She said that child marriage and early unions entailed violations of rights and had been a matter of concern during the pandemic. In a broader sense, the pandemic had affected young women and girls, and she requested inclusion of their voices in the next session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean.

29. The representative of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) expressed concern regarding rises in inequality, gender-based violence and discrimination in the context of the pandemic, which had affected displaced women and girls in particular. She insisted on the need to address this situation and to ensure that national protection mechanisms functioned properly.

30. The representative of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) agreed that it was important for the document to examine the issue of intersectorality in more detail, with specific analysis of community care in rural and urban areas. She also suggested strengthening analysis of the issue of women migrant domestic workers and describing measures implemented in the countries. She then highlighted the innovation and creativity of public care policies, including Argentina's work with the infrastructure sector and investment in infrastructure and transportation measures to reduce the time use linked to care.

31. The representative of the International Domestic Workers Federation (IDWF) said it was important for care issues to be included in government budgets and for there to be intersectional and comprehensive national care plans that took into account domestic workers' unions. She suggested deepening the analysis in the document of plans for professionalization of domestic workers and recognition of their skills and urged countries to ratify and implement the International Labour Organization (ILO) Domestic Workers Convention, 2011 (No. 189).

Preparations for the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean (agenda item 3)

32. Statements were made by Ana Güzmes García, Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC; María-Noel Vaeza, Regional Director for the Americas and the Caribbean of UN-Women; Elizabeth Gómez Alcorta, Minister for Women, Gender and Diversity of Argentina and representative of the host country of the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, and Santiago Cafiero, Minister of Foreign Affairs, International Trade and Worship of Argentina.

33. The Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC said that the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean was convened every three years with a mandate to review the regional situation with respect to women's autonomy and gender equality, formulate proposals and assess observance of regional agreements. She noted the links of the Conference with other subsidiary bodies of ECLAC and presented the road map for its fifteenth session, which included a meeting with specialized agencies, a workshop for journalists and an activity with girls and young women. She then outlined the proposed organization of work for the session of the Conference.<sup>3</sup>

34. The Regional Director for the Americas and the Caribbean of UN-Women described the progress made with regard to the Regional Fund in Support of Women's and Feminist Organizations and Movements. She also highlighted the importance of the parliamentary forum event, to be held within the framework of the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference was important for progress on drafting laws to create care systems and on eliminating laws that discriminated against women and girls. She then highlighted the work of the Regional Alliance for Women's Digitalization in Latin America and the Caribbean, as part of the Generation Equality Forum, and expressed her hope that the session of the Conference would also make progress in the area of digitalization.

35. The Minister for Women, Gender and Diversity of Argentina and representative of the host country of the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean described the preparations for the Conference, which had involved coordination with the countries and the vital participation of feminist and transfeminist movements. She said that she expected a high level of participation in the Forum of Latin American and Caribbean Feminist Organizations and that Argentina proposed holding a parliamentary forum in the context of the Regional Conference. It was important to have a cutting-edge position paper that outlined the close link between the sexual division of labour and the development model.

36. The Minister of Foreign Affairs, International Trade and Worship of Argentina said it was important to reaffirm the commitment to gender equality by making the strategic objectives of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action a reality. Construction of a true care society would lay the foundations for a sustainable recovery with gender equality in the region.

Presentation of progress in the preparation of the report on information systems, pillar 9 of the Montevideo Strategy for Implementation of the Regional Gender Agenda within the Sustainable Development Framework by 2030 (agenda item 4)

37. Statements were made by Xavier Mancero, Chief of the Social Statistics Unit of the Statistics Division of ECLAC, and Ana Güzmes García, Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC.

38. The Chief of the Social Statistics Unit of the Statistics Division of ECLAC described the gender mainstreaming process in the Statistical Conference of the Americas of ECLAC. He recalled the formation of the Working Group on Gender Statistics, the creation of an advisory group in 2020 to incorporate the gender perspective into all working groups and the development of the *Methodological guide on time-use measurements in Latin America and the Caribbean*.<sup>4</sup> He emphasized that the joint work between the Statistical Conference of the Americas of ECLAC and the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean had been pioneering in the region and had become a reference for the United Nations Statistical Commission.

39. The Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC recognized the efforts made to coordinate the Commission's subsidiary bodies—and, in the countries, national statistical systems—with national machineries for the advancement of women. She presented the contents of the report on information systems that was being prepared and underscored the production of data on the structural challenges posed by gender inequality and the regional architecture that had favoured the production of gender statistics and their comparability. She also stressed the importance of the institutional environment and the statistical process, partnerships between data producers and users, and the production of gender statistics in the region, such as those applied to the measurement and valuation of unpaid domestic and care work, and statistics on gender-based violence.

40. Next, the representative of Cuba highlighted the adoption in her country in 2021 of the National Programme for the Advancement of Women, which focused on the production of statistics, among other themes. She spoke about the creation of a scientific observatory on gender, the development of a comprehensive strategy to prevent and address gender-based violence and domestic violence, and an interactive platform to support the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals. She also highlighted the collaboration of the Centre for Women's Studies with the National Office of Statistics and Information in conducting studies.

41. The representative of Chile reported on the second time-use survey planned for 2023 and on improvements to the national survey on violence against women in the home and in other settings (ENVIF-VCM). She also reaffirmed the importance of the intersectional approach and of influencing the design of different surveys, as was the case with the incorporation of questions on sexual orientation and gender identity in the national socioeconomic survey (CASEN) and of the care dimension in the national survey on disability and dependency (ENDIDE).
42. The representative of Argentina highlighted the progress made with respect to statistics that captured intersectionality and included gender identity, indigenous and Afrodescendant self-recognition and migration status. She emphasized the importance of comparability and welcomed the creation of gender and diversity indicator systems, especially the federal map of care services. She also acknowledged the existence of gender bias in big data and the need to apply the gender perspective to the data revolution.
43. The representative of the Dominican Republic referred to the Observatory on Gender Equality, which operated under the Ministry of Women's Affairs, and the Observatory on Justice and Gender, which operated under the judiciary. She spoke of the launch of the Gender Statistics Strategy of the Dominican Republic for 2021–2024 and training in gender statistics in public institutions involved in statistical production. Lastly, she spoke about the Communities of Care pilot initiative.
44. The representative of Paraguay reported on the Women's Observatory established to contribute to the protection of women against violence and on the Regional Meeting on Care Policies, held in June 2022. She highlighted the implementation of the Gender Statistics Strategy, Paraguay 2021–2025 and the pending challenges relating to new surveys such as the time-use survey and the national survey on gender-based violence, the improvement of administrative data sources and the strengthening of statistical capacity.
45. The representative of Costa Rica reiterated the importance of inter-agency partnerships to ensure sustainability in the production of statistics with a gender perspective. She underscored the challenges and importance of strengthening the consideration of statistical production as a basis for public policy design.
46. The representative of Nicaragua highlighted inter-agency coordination bodies of the Ministry of Women's Affairs and expressed her country's commitment to continue strengthening the gender focus of the national statistics system.
47. The representative of El Salvador highlighted the intersectoral work done and shared information on a system of statistics and of monitoring compliance with national regulations to guarantee women's rights along with the situation and status of Salvadoran women. There was also a centre for information on substantive equality of the Salvadoran Institute for the Development of Women (ISDEMU), which provided public information made available by State institutions. In addition, she spoke about the preparation of a methodological guide for mainstreaming the gender perspective in the population census and the development of a new time-use survey.
48. The representative of Ecuador stressed the importance of recognizing inequalities in the life cycle of women. She said that her country had taken on the challenge of building a national system to prevent and eradicate violence against women and that, through the National Agenda for Gender Equality for 2022–2025, the gender perspective had been incorporated into Ecuador's national development plan. She underscored the importance of the State in building the care society and of those who undertook that work.

49. The representative of Uruguay spoke about the gender information system of the National Women's Institute, which had sought to highlight the intersectionality of discrimination. She also referred to the progress made in time-use surveys, the Observatory on Gender-based Violence against Women and preparations for the third National Survey on the Prevalence of Gender- and Generation-Based Violence in 2024.

Session commemorating the forty-fifth anniversary of the Regional Gender Agenda (agenda item 5)

*High-level panel: Contribution of the Regional Gender Agenda to policies on gender equality and women's autonomy in Latin America and the Caribbean*

50. This panel was moderated by Ana Gúezmes García, Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC, and panellists included Antonia Urrejola, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Chile; Nadine Gasman, President of the National Women's Institute (INMUJERES) of Mexico; Elizabeth Gómez Alcorta, Minister for Women, Gender and Diversity of Argentina; Osmayda Hernández Beleño, member of the National Secretariat of the Federation of Cuban Women; Marta Lucía Ramírez, Vice-President and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Colombia; Beatriz Argimón, Vice-President of Uruguay; Alicia Bárcena, former Executive Secretary of ECLAC; Adis King, Minister of Youth Development and Empowerment, Youth at Risk, Gender Affairs, Seniors Security and Dominicans with Disabilities of Dominica; Dean Jonas, Minister of Social Transformation, Human Resource Development and the Blue Economy of Antigua and Barbuda; Diana Miloslavich, Minister for Women's Affairs and Vulnerable Populations of Peru; Irene Montero, Minister of Equality of the Government of Spain; Juan Carlos Holguín, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Human Mobility of Ecuador; Enrique V. Iglesias, former Executive Secretary of ECLAC; Celina Lezcano, Minister for Women's Affairs of Paraguay, and Antonia Orellana, Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean.

51. The Chief of the Division for Gender Affairs of ECLAC recognized the legacy of the 45 years of the Regional Gender Agenda, which had positioned the region as the only one in the world with an intergovernmental forum within the regional framework of the United Nations to promote women's rights and gender equality. She highlighted the establishment of the concept of women's autonomy and the recognition of gender inequalities as a structural feature of an unsustainable development model. She also underscored the proposal to promote a development model that placed gender equality and women's rights and autonomy at the centre, and the importance of gender architecture in the State for the design and implementation of comprehensive policies and sufficient resources. She recalled that it would be impossible to achieve gender equality without the redistribution of time, power and resources.

52. The Minister of Foreign Affairs of Chile recalled the first Regional Conference on the Integration of Women into the Economic and Social Development of Latin America, held in Havana, and the mandate given to ECLAC to convene, on a permanent and regular basis, the main forum for negotiating the Regional Gender Agenda. She acknowledged the political and legislative progress towards gender equality and expressed her satisfaction at representing a government that had defined itself as feminist and had proposed a feminist foreign policy. Lastly, she noted that, for the first time in history, two women would head the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

53. The President of the National Women's Institute (INMUJERES) of Mexico spoke about the National Programme for Equality between Women and Men (PROIGUALDAD) for 2020–2024. She reported on the coordination of a national care system and the progress made in recognizing care as a right. She also underscored the joint work with ECLAC and UN-Women to generate knowledge on investment in care and its translation into greater equality and growth, and the creation of the Global Alliance for Care. Lastly, she expressed her agreement with the need to put women's autonomy at the centre of policies.

54. The Minister for Women, Gender and Diversity of Argentina acknowledged the notable progress made in many countries of the region in terms of institutionalization thanks to the standards established in the Regional Gender Agenda, one example being the creation of the first Ministry for Women, Gender and Diversity in Argentina. She described other advances, such as the Acompañar programme and a strategy to move forward in building a comprehensive care system. She also shared the initiative of Argentina and Mexico to present a declaration to the United Nations Human Rights Council that would recognize care as a human rights issue.

55. The member of the National Secretariat of the Federation of Cuban Women recognized the important work of feminist movements and social organizations in building fairer and more equitable societies. She mentioned Cuba's National Programme for the Advancement of Women and the strong representation of women in power structures in the country. Lastly, she spoke of the necessary relationship between development and gender equality, and said that without gender equality, the sustainable development agenda would achieve neither development nor sustainability.

56. The Vice-President and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Colombia said that although there had been progress towards achieving gender parity in cabinets in the region and in Colombia, that was not enough. More women had to participate in the economic and political spheres in order to generate more wealth and employment. She referred to the integration into the National Development Plan for 2018–2022 of actions related to women's participation in politics, violence prevention and economic autonomy, and the pillars of the national care system.

57. The Vice-President of Uruguay recalled that legislation on women's rights had been championed in her country early on. She also underscored the importance of strengthening gender institutions to encourage their impact on public policies. Lastly, she emphasized the leading role that public policy should play in fostering women's economic empowerment.

58. The former Executive Secretary of ECLAC highlighted the achievements relating to gender in the region, such as the institutionalization of machineries for the advancement of women and the progress made by women's and feminist movements, the advances in economic autonomy and those related to breaking the statistical silence, the existence of the Gender Equality Observatory and the entry into force of the Regional Agreement on Access to Information, Public Participation and Justice in Environmental Matters in Latin America and the Caribbean (Escazú Agreement). She underscored the central role of care at the current historical moment, when discriminatory and conservative discourse was resurgent, and said that the region was a pioneer in care and co-responsibility policies. She reaffirmed the need for fiscal, productive, labour and other public policies that would free up women's time, and said that it was necessary to move from a culture of privilege and patriarchy to a culture of equality.

59. The Minister of Youth Development and Empowerment, Youth at Risk, Gender Affairs, Seniors Security and Dominicans with Disabilities of Dominica highlighted the active participation and inclusion of different social and income groups in national plans and programmes, which contributed to their success. She also spoke about the incorporation of the gender perspective in government bodies and support for women victims of gender-based violence. In addition, she recalled Dominica's vulnerability to climate change.

60. The Minister of Social Transformation, Human Resource Development and the Blue Economy of Antigua and Barbuda underscored the importance of mainstreaming gender in disaster management and capacity-building with key stakeholders in that area. He also mentioned his country's responses to gender-based violence and the design of a national policy against discrimination and harassment in the workplace for the country's public sector. With respect to women's political participation, he spoke of the establishment of a women's network to strengthen capacities.

61. The Minister for Women's Affairs and Vulnerable Populations of Peru highlighted the creation of her ministry 26 years earlier, and underscored the impact on the full participation of women in public office of the Quito Consensus, adopted at the tenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, held in 2007. She spoke about Law 31030, which modified electoral law to guarantee gender parity and alternation in the lists of candidates, and Law 31155, which prevented and punished harassment of women in the political arena. She recalled that the Quito Consensus had also been decisive for the implementation of the national time-use survey in her country and said that the Peruvian State was promoting legislation for the creation of a comprehensive care system and the recognition of the right to care. Lastly, she recalled the relationship between economic autonomy and the food crisis and spoke about the development of an entrepreneurship strategy for rural and indigenous women in Peru.

62. The Minister of Equality of the Government of Spain spoke of the major challenges faced in the pursuit of equality, such as the transformation of the existing economic model. She said that care had become a State issue and reaffirmed that institutional architecture, an intersectional perspective and the investment of public resources to build and maintain care systems were essential. The redistribution of time was fundamental for women to develop their life projects. She also said that feminist institutional policy should focus on the fight against violence against women and LGBTI persons and stressed the importance of international feminist alliances.

63. The Minister of Foreign Affairs and Human Mobility of Ecuador recognized ECLAC for promoting the Regional Gender Agenda and civil society for its fight for the recognition of rights. He spoke about the impact of the pandemic on women and the need to continue addressing its effects with the "purple economy". The Government of Ecuador would continue to work on public policies to narrow inequality gaps and address key issues such as violence and femicide, migration and care work. Lastly, he called for the strengthening of multilateralism.

64. The former Executive Secretary of ECLAC recalled the background of the first Regional Conference on the Integration of Women into the Economic and Social Development of Latin America and the women's movement in Santiago at that time, which had requested support from the United Nations in cases of detainees and missing persons in Chile. He also spoke about the mobilization for gender equality by the United Nations to carry forward the principles adopted at the World Conference of the International Women's Year in 1975. Lastly, he acknowledged that progress had been slow but concrete.

65. The Minister for Women's Affairs of Paraguay described the progress made in the institutionalization of gender in her country within the framework of the Secretariat for Women of the Office of the President of the Republic. She highlighted the fourth National Equality Plan for 2018–2024 and shared progress in terms of women's access to education, political representation and decision-making positions. The pandemic had shown that progress could be reversed alarmingly and that that should be an impetus for increased investment in gender equality policies and programmes.

66. The Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, reaffirmed that the Regional Gender Agenda had been a response from women's movements and multilateralism to move forward in times of crisis. In Chile, a feminist government had been proposed, with the collective action of women's movements and intersectoral coordination serving as a paradigm for changing the country's unjust reality. The care agenda would be an opportunity to relegitimize democracy and broaden the understanding of the rule of law, to show the path of peace, security and transformation that would put the sustainability of life at the centre in times of global crisis.

*High-level panel: Partnerships, achievements and challenges in advancing the Regional Gender Agenda*

67. The panel was moderated by Antonia Orellana, Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, and the participants included María-Noel Vaeza, Regional Director for the Americas and the Caribbean of UN-Women; Gladys Acosta Vargas, Chairperson of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women; Alejandra Mora, Executive Secretary of the Inter-American Commission of Women (CIM) of the Organization of American States (OAS); Virginia Vargas, co-founder of the Flora Tristán Centre of Peru; Ayesha Constable, founder of Young People for Action on Climate Change Jamaica, and Paola Yáñez, General Coordinator of the Network of Afro-Latin American, Afro-Caribbean and Diaspora Women.

68. The Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, said that the panel was intended to foster dialogue between representatives of the United Nations system, intergovernmental organizations, international cooperation entities, women's and feminist organizations and civil society. She said that the dialogue would be intergenerational and a fundamental element of the region's history.

69. The Regional Director for the Americas and the Caribbean of UN-Women stressed the importance of the State's coordination with and firm commitment to civil society and of the support of the entities of the United Nations system for the advancement of the Regional Gender Agenda. She spoke about the strategic alliance with ECLAC, with which two regional consultations had been held prior to the sessions of the Commission on the Status of Women. She also mentioned the regional consultation on general recommendation No. 39 on the rights of indigenous women and girls. Lastly, she stressed the importance of the Global Alliance for Care.

70. The Chairperson of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women spoke about some challenging areas: gender-based violence, women's participation in public life, job losses among women owing to the pandemic and the need to overcome precarious employment, sexual and reproductive health rights and the dangerous increase in maternal mortality during the pandemic, and the digital divide. She noted that general recommendation No. 39 on the rights of indigenous women and girls was expected to be adopted in October 2022 and underscored the organization's joint work with indigenous women.

71. The Executive Secretary of the Inter-American Commission of Women (CIM) of OAS said that women had historically fought for spaces and commended the partnerships built to advance the implementation of the Regional Gender Agenda through collective processes. She recalled that the Convention of Belém do Pará had been revolutionary in breaking the dichotomy between public and private and in establishing a continuous framework for analysing the new forms of violence reproduced by power relationships. She stressed the importance of women benefiting from adequate representation.

72. The co-founder of the Flora Tristán Centre of Peru recognized the ECLAC Division for Gender Affairs for its contribution to the Regional Gender Agenda. She underscored the collaboration with civil society and the use of tools such as ISOQuito and ISOMontevideo to monitor the Agenda. She also highlighted the contributions to a care society and the development of frameworks to reflect the diversity of women. She reflected on the current paradigm crisis, the unsustainable nature of the development model and the need to break with that economic, political and cultural model in order to recognize the interdependence and eco-dependence of people and the planet. One of the most valuable contributions of feminism had been the deepening of democracy and the role of civil society at that time was to prevent setbacks.

73. The founder of Young People for Action on Climate Change Jamaica spoke of the relationship between greater gender inequality and the increased likelihood of more devastating socioeconomic impacts of climate change. Gender parity in political participation should be a driver for reducing climate vulnerability and mechanisms were needed to monitor the strategies recommended by the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change. Intergenerational dialogue was critical to ensure a sustainable future and combining experience with innovation and the energy of the youngest actors was imperative to forge movements for climate justice and gender justice.

74. The General Coordinator of the Network of Afro-Latin American, Afro-Caribbean and Diaspora Women recalled the significance of the first Meeting of Black Women of Latin America and the Caribbean held in Santo Domingo in 1992. She also stressed the importance of the Brasilia Consensus because it marked a new stage in the consideration of the situation of women of African descent. Among the achievements she mentioned, she underscored the dialogue with intergovernmental institutions in the region, and mentioned as unresolved challenges the effective application of regulatory instruments, access to justice and the cultural barriers faced by Afrodescendent and indigenous women. She recognized the progress made in statistics on the Afrodescendent population, particularly the incorporation of the self-identification variable in censuses, and warned of the need for progress in the generation of information based on administrative records. She said that paid domestic work had shown the intersection of socioeconomic, gender, racial and ethnic inequalities.

75. In the ensuing discussion, the Minister of Social Development of Panama, in her capacity as President of the Inter-American Commission of Women (CIM) of OAS, underscored the importance of the collaboration between ECLAC, UN-Women and CIM, and with civil society organizations, private entities and the academic sector. She stressed the need to promote gender parity in the executive and judicial branches and the elimination of structural barriers to women's economic empowerment.

76. The representative of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) said that the Santiago Commitment recognized the rights of migrant women throughout the migration cycle. She highlighted the recommendations of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women in the case of health emergencies in a context of climate change, environmental degradation and disasters. She also underscored the challenge of addressing the various issues faced by migrant women in the migration cycle and said it was imperative to recognize the contribution to global care chains, which had enabled many women to enter the labour market. She mentioned the fourth Regional Congress on Women in Migration Contexts as an example of a fruitful partnership in that area and spoke of the challenge of generating gender-sensitive migration data.

#### Other matters (agenda item 6)

77. There being no further matters to consider, the meeting was brought to a close.

#### **Closing session**

78. In her closing remarks, the Minister of Women's Affairs and Gender Equity of Chile, in her capacity as Chair of the Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, expressed her gratitude for the participation of the ministers and high-level authorities of organizations for the advancement of women in the region, representatives of ECLAC member States and associate members, agencies of the United Nations system, resident coordinators of the United Nations, intergovernmental organizations, civil society organizations and the former Executive Secretaries of ECLAC. Lastly, she expressed her appreciation to ECLAC and UN-Women, and thanked Argentina for its support in the run up to the fifteenth session of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean, to be held in November 2022 in Buenos Aires.
